# **CUBA SANCTIONS**

Following President Obama's announcement of major policy changes with Cuba, the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) announced new regulations on January 15 relating to limited trade and travel with Cuba. The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) is publish expected to their regulations within a few days. The general embargo remains in place and cannot be removed without new legislation from Congress. The White House and OFAC have published Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) documents.

### 2015 TARIFF SCHEDULE

- The 2015 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) went into effect on January 1. Changes include removina Russia from Generalized System of Preferences (GSP), adding Madagascar and Guinea-Bissau as beneficiary countries under the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA), and extending the 2004 agricultural agreement with Israel.
- Census has <u>updated</u> the Schedule B and HTSUS <u>tables</u> for use in the Automated Export System (AES). As of January 31, AES will only accept the 2015 HTSUS or Schedule B.

# **NEW AES LICENSE CODES**

Census has <u>introduced</u> new "license type codes" for exporters who have filed disclosures with Commerce, State, and other agencies. Companies need to use these codes carefully and correctly because they will highlight the AES filings. Contact Sean Murray with questions.

# **CRIMEAN RESTRICTIONS**

President Obama has issued Executive Order 13685, which blocks some Crimean persons, bans U.S. investment in Crimea. prohibits the import and export of goods to or from Crimea, and prohibits U.S. person facilitation of involving transactions Crimea. General License 4 permits the export of agricultural commodities, medicine, medical products, and their replacement parts. General License 5 allows U.S. persons to "wind-down" activities in Crimea by February 1, 2015. 79 Fed. Reg. 77357 (Dec. 24, 2014).

# **MANIFEST CONFIDENTIALITY**

With the proliferation of companies searching through vessel manifest data electronically, clients are reminded that they may request confidentiality for inbound and outbound manifests from Customs. Contact Chuck Ballard with questions.

# **RUSSIAN SANCTIONS**

President Obama has signed legislation (H.R. <u>5859</u>) that allows the President to place more restrictions on trade with Russia. The new law requires sanctions on Rosoboronexport. Russian entities that sell and transfer weapons to Syria may also be sanctioned. The White House has indicated that it is not currently planning any additional sanctions.

# PHARMACEUTICAL APPENDIX

The next round of additions to the HTS Pharmaceutical Appendix may be concluded in 2016. Companies looking to include new products need to act quickly before the list is finalized. Contact Sean Murray with questions.

# **EXPORTS TO HONG KONG**

Items controlled for "NS 2" now require a license to ship to Hong Kong unless a license exception applies. 79 Fed. Reg. <u>76867</u> (Dec. 23, 2014).

# **EPA FINAL RULE**

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reissued a Final Rule on labeling requirements for pesticide products and devices intended for export. The effective date is February 17, 2015. 79 Fed. Reg. 75752 (Dec. 19, 2014).

### **ORIGIN LITIGATION**

Origin marking and "Made in USA" claims remain significant issues for many companies. Contact Sean Murray with questions.

- A U.S. federal district court has denied a domestic competitor's request for a preliminary injunction against a company who failed to mark imported cookie cutters with their country of origin. The domestic competitor is pursuing the case under the Lanham Act, which provides a cause of action for false origin designations. Ann Clark, Ltd. v. R&M Int'l Corp., Case No. 1:14-cv-00143 (Dec. 29, 2014).
- Apparel companies sued in a class action for allegedly violating California's "Made in USA" state law have sought to dismiss the case, arguing it is impossible to comply with both the California and federal laws with a qualified "Made in USA" origin claim. Clark v. Citizens of Humanity, LLC, Case No. 3:14-CV-01404-JLS-WVG (Jan. 9, 2015).

#### **NEW SDN FORMAT**

On January 5, OFAC announced an <u>upgraded format</u> for its list of Special Designated Nationals (SDNs). The new SDN list format will include more data. OFAC has issued a list of <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> on the new format.

# **NEW N. KOREA SANCTIONS**

President Obama has issued Executive Order (EO) 13687, imposing additional sanctions on North Korea. Since the United States already has a comprehensive embargo on North Korea, the new EO is not expected to impact many U.S. entities. 80 Fed. Reg. 817 (Jan. 6, 2015).

# **ACE DEPLOYMENT D**

On January 3, 2015, Customs deployed Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) core trade processing capabilities for Manifest, Entry Summary, Accounts and Revenue – eBond, and Exports. CSMS #15-000006 (Jan. 6, 2015).

#### **CRUDE OIL EXPORTS**

On December 30, the BIS published a list of "Frequently Asked Questions" on the export of crude oil. Although crude oil still requires an export license, BIS has indicated that lease condensate processed through a distillation tower may be considered a petroleum product, which is subject to fewer export controls.

# **U.S.-CHILE FTA**

On January 1, 2015, the last tariff <u>phase-outs</u> under the U.S.-Chile FTA went into force. Even the most sensitive items, such as Chilean wine, now enter the U.S. duty-free.

# **CH. 85 CLASSIFICATION**

The Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit has refused to classify actuators that include an electric motor, gears, and printed boards circuit as automatic regulating and controlling instruments of HTSUS subheading 9032.89.60 (1.7%), classifying them as electric motors in subheading 8501.10.40 (4.4%).Belimo Automation A.G. v. U.S., CAFC Slip Op. 2014-1165 (Dec. 19, 2014).

# **ECCN CLARIFICATIONS**

BIS has made some minor changes to the **Export** Administration Regulations (EAR) and published clarifications to five "600 Series" Export Control Classification Numbers (ECCNs) relating to radar, military aircraft, marine systems, and encryption. The Directorate of Defense Trade Controls also made some minor changes to the International Traffic in Arms Regulations. 79 Fed. Reg. 76874 (Dec. 23, 2014); 79 Fed. Reg. 77862 (Dec. 24, 2014); and 79 Fed. Reg. 77884 (Dec. 29, 2014).

# **AGOA**

President Obama recently issued Proclamation 9223, reinstating Guinea-Bissau as an AGOA beneficiary country, suspending Gambia, and making technical changes. 79 Fed. Reg. 78681 (Dec. 30, 2014).

### **IRAN**

- The U.S. State Department has published a clarification of the sanctions relief granted following the extension of the negotiations with the U.S. and other nations and Iran. Most U.S. sanctions remain in place. 79 Fed. Reg. 78550 (Dec. 30, 2014).
- Congress is discussing legislation to impose tougher sanctions on Iran if the negotiations falter. The legislation would also require that Congress approve any negotiated settlement.

#### FDA – ENTRY REVIEW PILOT

The FDA recently completed its Centralized Entry Review (CER) pilot evaluation and released its findings. CSMS #14-000653 (Dec. 19, 2014).

#### **CUSTOMS AND FDA**

Los Angeles Customs has announced the creation of a new Federal Destruction and Redelivery Team (Team FDR) of FDA and Customs officials and updated procedures to process FDA refused shipments at the LA/Long Beach ports. A combined FDA/CBP Refusal Redelivery Notice will be issued.

# **END-USE & ELECTRONICS**

The BIS has published new military end-use restrictions on a wide variety of microprocessors. Since most electronics, including microprocessors are sold via incountry distributors, ensuring control may be difficult. 79 Fed Reg. 75044 (Dec. 17, 2014).

The next broker's license exam is scheduled for April 13, 2015.
