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# FTZ TEMPORARY REMOVAL

Customs has issued a ruling that medical devices may not be removed from FTZs for sterilization under Temporary Removal procedures because sterilization is a manufacturing process under the drawback laws. Contact Marshall Miller with questions. HQ <u>H233345</u> (June 21, 2013).

# **GSP UPDATE**

- The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) expired on July House and Senate 31. 2013. Committees have introduced identical bills to renew GSP through September 30, 2015. HR 2709 (July 17, 2013) and S. 1331 (July 18, 2013). There is also discussion of including GSP renewal in an **Omnibus** Trade Bill Miscellaneous Tariff Bill provisions, Trade Promotion Authority (formerly Adjustment fast-track). Trade Assistance (TAA), and African Opportunity Growth and (AGOA) provisions.
- The Obama Administration has announced an <u>action plan</u> for working with stakeholders and Bangladesh to ensure the country improves worker safety, which will support reinstatement of GSP benefits.

#### **BIS VOLUNTARY DISCLOSURES**

The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) has issued a Final Rule that requires exporters who make an initial Voluntary Self-Disclosure (VSD) to perfect their disclosure within 180 days. BIS has the authority to extend the 180 days, but has indicated they do not expect to routinely grant extensions. 78 Fed. Reg. 48601 (August 9, 2013).

# **CUSTOMS COMMISSIONER**

President Obama has nominated Mr. Gil Kerlikowske to be the next Commissioner of Customs. Mr. Kerlikowske is currently the Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy. He will need to be confirmed by the U.S. Senate.

# **BIS END USE CHECKS**

David Mills, the BIS Assistant Secretary for Export Enforcement, indicated at the BIS Annual Update conference on July 24 that BIS did more end use checks last year than it has over the past five years. As USML items migrate to the CCL, end use checks will likely become more common.

# **EXPORT REFORM**

- The BIS and the Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) published a Proposed Rule on July 25 to move certain military electronics from the U.S. Munitions List (USML) to the Commerce Control List (CCL). Comments on the Proposed Rule are due September 9. 78 Fed. Reg. 45017 (July 25, 2013) and 78 Fed. Reg. 45026 (July 25, 2013).
- Officials at the BIS Annual Update conference indicated that they are working on moving toxicological agents and night vision equipment from the USML to the CCL. A Proposed Rule is anticipated by Fall. Officials also stated they are working toward a single licensing entity.

# **CONFLICT MINERALS**

A federal district court has upheld the Securities and Exchange Commission's 2012 conflict minerals regulations against several challenges by business The conflict minerals groups. reporting requirement begins May 31, 2014. # **ACE STATUS UPDATE**

Customs has <u>issued</u> dates for mandatory use of ACE, including Manifest by May 1, 2015, Cargo Release by November 1, 2015, and full use by October 1, 2015. The Automated Commercial System (ACS) is scheduled to be decommissioned by the end of 2016.

# **FDA UPDATE**

The FDA has issued Proposed Rule on foreign supplier verification programs (FSVP) for imported food for humans and The FSVP includes a animals. provision requiring importers to conduct annual food safety audits foreian supplier facilities. Comments are due November 26. 78 Fed. Reg. 45729 (July 29, 2013).

#### **IRANIAN MEDICAL**

The Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) has published changes to the list of medical supplies that have been identified as EAR99 and are eligible for a general license for export to Iran. OFAC has also published changes to their frequently asked questions, and guidance on exporting medicines, medical devices, food, and agricultural products.

#### **DCMA ENTRIES**

Customs has ended its 100% requirement for entries review claiming duty-free treatment of articles for military departments **HTSUS** under subheading 9808.00.30. The submission of a duty-free certificate is no longer unless a "documents required required" message is received. However, the certificate must still be obtained from the Defense Contract Management Agency (DCMA) and available upon request. CSMS #13-000356 (July 18, 2013).

#### **VD & STILL FINED \$8 MILLION**

Despite filing Voluntary Disclosures (VDs) and taking corrective actions. Aeroflex Incorporated has been fined \$8 million by the DDTC. The reasons for the large fine were stated as the nature of the products and the systematic, long-standing nature of the violations. It also appears a concern was that Aeroflex was not advising customers that the products were ITAR-controlled, and these customers were in turn exporting the products without the required DDTC licenses.

# **CUSTOMS BUSINESS**

In <u>HQ H167815</u> (June 28, 2013), Customs ruled that the review of previously-filed Customs entry forms by a customs broker's billing verification employees constitutes "Customs business" that requires a customs broker license because a broker has a duty to advise its importer client of any inaccuracies which could lead to entry corrections.

#### **SPLIT SHIPMENTS & AES**

The <u>Census Bureau</u> has indicated that shipments split by a carrier to move separately will not require a separate Electronic Export Information (EEI) filing in the Automated Export System (AES) unless the shipment does not move within 24 hours if moving via vessel, or 7 days if moving via air, truck or rail. #### **PERSONAL PENALTIES**

The Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit (CAFC) has ruled that corporate officers and shareholders cannot be held directly liable for their corporations' negligent misstatements Customs entry documentation. barring proof of individual fraud or the corporate veil being pierced. U.S. v. Trek Leather, Inc., CAFC Slip Op. <u>11-1527</u> (July 30, 2013).

# **ABI AIR IN-BOND**

Beginning on August 18, any Immediate Export (I.E.) in-bond air shipment from a Southern border port to Mexico must include the Mexican Pedimento Entry Number or it will be rejected by ACS, and the I.E. movement will not be authorized. CSMS #13-000406 (August 13, 2013).

#### **STA REVIEWS**

Matthew Borman, the BIS Deputy Undersecretary for Export Administration, indicated at a July 31 Atlantic Council event that about 10% of BIS audited companies did not comply with the provisions of the Strategic Trade Authorization (STA) license exception.

# FORGED USDA FORM

Raquel Molina, an employee of a Miami food supply company, was fined \$500 for forging the signature of a U.S. Export/Import veterinary medical officer on a USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) form.

#### **SUPPLY CHAIN PENALTIES**

- Seattle area company, Precision Image Corporation (PIC), is facing up to \$1 million in fines, and its owner up to 20 years in prison, for sending International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) controlled technology to Taiwan without a license. The Navy contracted with PIC to make printed circuit boards (PCBs). PIC's owner, Chih-Kwang-Hwa contracted with a Taiwan company to build the PCBs. allegedly with knowledge the technology required an export license.
- The Department of Justice has <a href="https://doi.org/nc.10/10/2012/">charged</a> Peter Picone, Methuen, Massachusetts, with importing counterfeit semiconductors from China and selling them to defense contractors in the United States.
- GuildMaster, Inc., a Springfield, Missouri company, recently pled guilty in federal court to importing thousands of lamps from China bearing counterfeit safety certification labels.

# **BURMA IMPORTS**

President Obama has issued Executive Order 13651, which extends the ban on imports of rubies and jadeite from Burma/ Myanmar. Most other imports from Burma are now permitted. 78 Fed Reg. 48793 (August 9, 2013).
