NAFTA CASE

The U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas has rejected a Ford Motor Company motion to dismiss a Customs NAFTA record-keeping claim for \$42 million. Ford had refused to Customs-requested backup documentation for NAFTA certificates of origin issued by a wholly-owned Mexican subsidiary. This ruling permits Customs to continue its case against Ford. The case suggests one way that Customs will attempt to hold importers liable for NAFTA claims instead of directly proceeding IMPORT SAFETY against the issuers of NAFTA Certificates. that Ford owned and controlled the vendor in question may be central to the case, so the real impact of the case remains to be involving around 18 million play- extended to April 1, 2008. seen.
