C-TPAT

- Customs has issued a new strategic plan to increase the incentives and benefits to C-TPAT participants. Customs has proposed a two level C-TPAT certification process. Importers are C-TPAT certified. validated, and use best practices will be given a "Green Lane" with no security inspections, while other C-TPAT participants meeting minimal security standards will continue to receive security inspections, though fewer non-C-TPAT than importers.
- Customs will be holding a supply chain security training seminar on April 18-21, 2005 in Miami, Florida for certified C-TPAT members only. The first come. first served on-line registration process began on February 14.

EU/US RICE WAR

The USTR has issued a list of tariff provisions for which duties may be raised, if the EU does not revise its rice import regime by March 1. 70 Fed. Reg. 6065 (Feb. 4, 2005).
