Customs has proposed a new interpretation of which sale "sale the qualifies as for exportation" when determining transaction value in import transactions involving multiple sales. C-TPAT 2007 STATISTICS

Customs has posted summary of C-TPAT statistics for 2007. Of particular interest, while importers, 3,011 validations were conducted operations. (601 were revalidations), Tier 3 status was granted to only 17 companies. In comparison, 112 preparations. companies were suspended or removed for security breaches or failing to meet the minimum FTZ BACKGROUND CHECKS criteria. Customs is making it receive Tier 3 status.
