EXPORT REVIEW/UPGRADE

Clients are urged to take time summer to focus upgrading export compliance. It is only a matter of months before Census will require all export documentation to be transmitted electronically through Increased seizures and questions concerning export shipments abound. The new Census Regulations also provide an array of significant enforcement and penalty mechanisms that. Now is the time to order new or updated Census data in order to identify issues with past submissions and to structure a thorough export FTZ SELF-MONITORING compliance program. EXPORT VIOLATIONS

- updated BIS has publication "Don't Let This Happen to You!," which is an introduction to U.S. export control law and provides summary details of export control and antiboycott violations. Clients encouraged to provide copies to senior management to encourage funding/staffing compliance efforts.
- Since April 15th, BIS has issued press releases on six export enforcement cases, with FTZ AUTOMATION penalties of \$1.13 million and multiple criminal indictments.

CUSTOMS BROKER EXAM

Customs has posted its April 2005 Broker's exam and answer key to its web site. unconfirmed pass rate was 5.8%, down from 9% in October 2004.

C-TPAT

- As of this past April, Customs validated 549 C-TPAT certified companies; 173 of these were importers. Almost 100 companies were decertified and suspended from the program for negative validations, failing to meet their C-TPAT commitments, or because their supply chain security was compromised. This equates to nearly 20% of the certified companies failing their validation and losing their C-TPAT certification. Removal from C-TPAT causes an immediate increase in exams and removal from ISA and FAST.
- On April 21. Commissioner Bonner formally announced tiered benefits for C-TPAT partners. The first tier would consist of certified C-TPAT companies provision would require subzone receiving reduced examinations. operators to notify the FTZB and The second tier would consist of submit an Expansion Application validated C-TPAT companies that activity receive even fewer exams.
