ACE

At the Trade Support Network (TSN) meeting, it was announced that many key functions will not be available until 2009/2010. In addition, though the ACE staffing is at 900, Customs will require significant company trade support through 2006 to complete basic programming.

CUSTOMS BUSINESS

Customs has issued a ruling that slightly expands on and clarifies limitations its on corporate compliance functions performing "corporate compliance activities." Customs ruled that employees of one wholly-owned subsidiary could provide classification and valuation information, as well as other unspecified "input and advice" to another wholly-owned subsidiary, and provide "information" to a broker "for the filing of entries." Responding to CF28/29s audit inquiries, and and submission of PEAs and SILs ruled be was to impermissible. HQ 116220 (June 21, 2004).

EXPORT REDELIVERY

EXPORT MANAGEMENT

FED SENTENCING GUIDES

The U.S. Supreme Court decision in <u>Blakely v. Washington</u> (No. 02-1362) undercut the validity of the Federal Sentencing Guidelines and similar state guidelines with a holding that the U.S. Constitution requires that sentencing decisions under such guidelines should be based on jury fact findings rather than judicial fact determinations.

REGULATORY AGENDAS

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ANTIDUMPING

preliminary affirmative Α antidumping duty determination has been made by the International Trade Administration (ITA) on wooden bedroom furniture from China. The rates range from 7.04% to 198.08%. Comments are to be submitted by July 31, 2004. 69 Fed. Reg. 35312 (June 24, 2004).

• Preliminary <u>antidumping</u> duty investigations made by the ITA determined that shrimp from China and Vietnam were sold at prices well below fair market value. The proposed duties range from 8% to 113% for China, and 12% to 93% for Vietnam. The case will now go back to the USITC for final determination.

MARITIME SECURITY

Effective July 1, the Coast Guard denied entry to nine foreign vessels, 10 were expelled, and 30 were detained in port or had their operations restricted during July 1–6, for noncompliance with the International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Code and Maritime Security Transportation Act (MTSA). Thirty-three U.S. vessels and 18 U.S. port facilities were restricted or suspended from certain operations for noncompliance with MTSA.
