The CIT has issued two very significant cases involving Ford Motor Company. Ford was found negligent in one and grossly negligent in the second for failures to properly declare values value adjustments Approximately \$20 Customs. million in penalties plus interest were assessed. CHINA SAFEGUARDS

- The Committee on Textile has Agreements (CITA) has posted on its web site Census data for China-origin textile and apparel, including those that are subject to safeguard proceedings. The list includes the estimated 4- month prorated safeguard quantity if the safeguard is implemented from August through December 31, 2005.
 - Customs has published entry procedures for safeguard excess shipments for cotton trousers from China (categories 347 and 348) as outlined in the Federal Register on April 26, 2005. Fed. Reg. 21399 (April 26, 2005).

BONDS — AD/CVD CASES

Customs has issued revised quidelines on setting bond amounts for merchandise subject to antidumping or countervailing duties, intended to better reflect the duty risk associated with entries of such merchandise and increase the amount of security required as necessary.
