FTZ SECTION 232 STEEL AND ALUMINUM TRADE REMEDY ADDITIONAL DUTIES ELIMINATION/REDUCTION MAY 30, 2019

CUSTOMS HAS PROVIDED INSTRUCTIONS (CSMS NO. 19-000271- MAY 30) ON PROCESSING FTZ TYPE 06 ENTRIES OF STEEL AND ALUMINUM FROM MEXICO AND CANADA.

For steel and aluminum from Canada or Mexico admitted to a zone under privileged foreign status between June 1, 2018 through May 19, 2019 that is entered for consumption after 12:01 am Eastern daylight time May 20, 2019, filers are no longer required to report HTSUS 9903.80.01 for steel or HTSUS 9903.85.01 for aluminum. Filers should report regular steel classifications in Chapter 72 or Chapter 73 and aluminum classifications in Chapter 76. In addition to these classifications, a new CBP product exclusion number for steel (STL060000) and aluminum (ALU020000) should be submitted in the Customs entry summary Importer Additional Field record (54). There are CBP generated unique product exclusion numbers solely for this purpose.

CUSTOMS HAS PROVIDED INSTRUCTIONS (CSMS NO. 19-000257- MAY 16) ON PROCESSING FTZ TYPE 06 ENTRIES OF STEEL FROM TURKEY AS THE RATE OF DUTY DECREASED FROM 50% TO 25%. For steel from Turkey admitted to a zone under privileged foreign status between August 13, 2018, through May 20, 2019 that is entered for consumption on or after 12:01 am eastern daylight time on May 21, 2019, filers should report HTSUS 9903.80.01, not HTSUS 9903.80.02, in addition to reporting the HTSUS classification in Chapter 72.

Use of HTSUS 9903.80.01 for steel from Turkey confirms the reduction in Section 232 duties on steel from Turkey entered for consumption after May 21, 2019.
